### Making an Impact



The **Food Closet** received an outpouring of community support throughout the year, particularly during the holiday season, helping us feed thousands of people.



Our **Brandywine Senior Center** bus was wrapped with brand-new graphics, helping both those using the bus to see it coming and also to promote the Senior Center in the community.



The **Learning Center** provided GED/ABE education, English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESL) classes, immigration assistance, tutoring resources, and credit recovery training for adults and children.



With support from BlackRock, our **Empowered Youth** program prospered. We added a golf
program -- in partnership with the American Lung
Association and First Tee of Delaware -- that
taught kids about the dangers of substance abuse.



Board members, businesses and community partners gave **nearly 3,000 hours of volunteer service** to our programs.



In May 2022, we were named an affiliate of the **National Park Service's Brown v. Board of Education National Historical Park**, through legislation signed into law by President Biden.




